As a young man I once owned a 1968 GTO convertible. I have loved GTO's since I was 16 and when I found they came in


convertible form I was hooked!

2023 Tiger on the Columbia – Wenatchee


Dear Club Members,

On Friday registration check-in will take place at the Wenatchee Convention Center. On Friday night we have planned a car cruise to the famous Hot Rod Café. Later on, that year I purchased a 66 GTO convertible that I still own. It was a lot of work to get that car put together and it is still not finished. It runs and drives now, and I've enjoyed many thousands of miles behind the wheel. I really love that car. My heart and soul are in its construction and rebirth.

But I have always had my eye on a 65 GTO to go with it. I really like the lines of a 65 and the fact that the key is on the left side of the steering wheel along with the more square and seemingly smaller body made it attractive. And of course, it would have to come in convertible form.

Casually looking through ads for 65 GTO's for sale on Facebook as they pop up would occasionally spark my interest, but the prices they were asking for these cars were certainly beyond my means right now.

Around Thanksgiving last year an ad popped up that caught my eye. A red 65 GTO convertible was posted for sale. A seemingly solid California car, it was a non-running project and at a price I could afford.

This car was an original Monaro Red 1965 GTO convertible. It features black interior with a white convertible top. Options included Tri-power, automatic transmission, air conditioning, power seat, console, and tinted windows. The Tri-power intake manifold was however missing and replaced with the four barrels.

I made casual conversation with the seller of the car who later contacted me. The ad placed on Facebook was quickly withdrawn after people's comments about the car were not to the owner's liking. In fact, they were not even about the car!

So, there were several people interested in purchasing the car but ultimately the owner chose me to have it. He patiently waited while I refinanced my house and got a little bit of money to buy it and fix it up.

In January I flew down to Boulder City, Nevada to check out the car in person. The car was everything the owner had described to me. It had a little bit of rust in the floors to be repaired and a little more in the trunk, but nothing compared with what I faced on my 66 convertible. The car would run with a little gas in the carburetor but a horrible knocking sound so shutting it off seemed wise. The car had mostly original paint and was quite straight and rust free on the exterior. I placed the deposit on the car and headed back home.


In February I called upon my friend and fellow club member Steve Martin to help me go and pick up this car. The seller agreed to meet me in Wells, Nevada to make the exchange.

We kind of hurriedly got ourselves together to go pick up the car ahead of an impending snowstorm in the area. Even though my home loan had been approved and was moving through the processes and I was assured any day it would fund, I still did not have the money to pay for the car just yet. But off to get it we went!

The first day of travel brought us to Burns, Oregon for the night. The next day was nice and sunny and took us across the southeast corner of Oregon into Winnemucca, Nevada.

Once in Nevada we followed interstate 80 across the North end of the state to meet up at Wells to pick up the car. I checked my bank account, and I still did not have any money!

About an hour out of Wells I checked my bank account for the 10th time that day and found that my loan had finally funded! Per my instructions, my credit union instantly transferred a portion of the money to the car's owner.















We had a pleasant drive home across the open country of Northern Nevada and Southern Oregon arriving back home in Washington a few days ahead of the snowstorm that we had.

Once at home I could explore the GTO more closely. I did eventually get it run a little better and the horrible knocking sound was a stuck lifter. I would work on it a little everyday getting lights to work again and windows to roll up and down and things of that nature since this car had not been in regular use for nearly 30 years!

It was an incredibly good find. Very few modifications had ever been made to this car. There was a lot of wear and tear, but complete, even the air conditioning system was intact!



As a side note this car was sold new in Corning, California and spent most of its life in San Francisco, California.

A compression test on the engine showed that cylinder number 7 was along for the ride. An appointment was made with Pacific Auto machine, one of our club sponsors in Renton, to rebuild the engine. I just happened to have a 1965 tri-power complete with carburetors in stock that will find its home on the rebuilt engine.

Last week I removed the engine from the car and disassembled it. The problem I saw with number seven was someone had dropped a screw inside of the engine and it had beat the piston up quite bad and put a hole in the top of it. I guess that explains all the oil smoke and the lack of compression!

During my refurbishment of this car, I plan to convert the automatic transmission to a 4-speed and have acquired all the necessary parts. While a full frame off restoration is in the future for this car, it will become now, a driver after the engine is rebuilt and with any luck will attend the Reunion show in July.



I am pleased with this car. It was purchased at a decent price and any money I put into it will be easily returned. I am extremely excited at a chance to work on this car and exploring all the differences a 65 has compared to what I am used to working on. I know I can look for many fun hours driving my 65 and mashing my foot into the tri-power and slamming the gears!



2021 Reunion show raffle table



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




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
